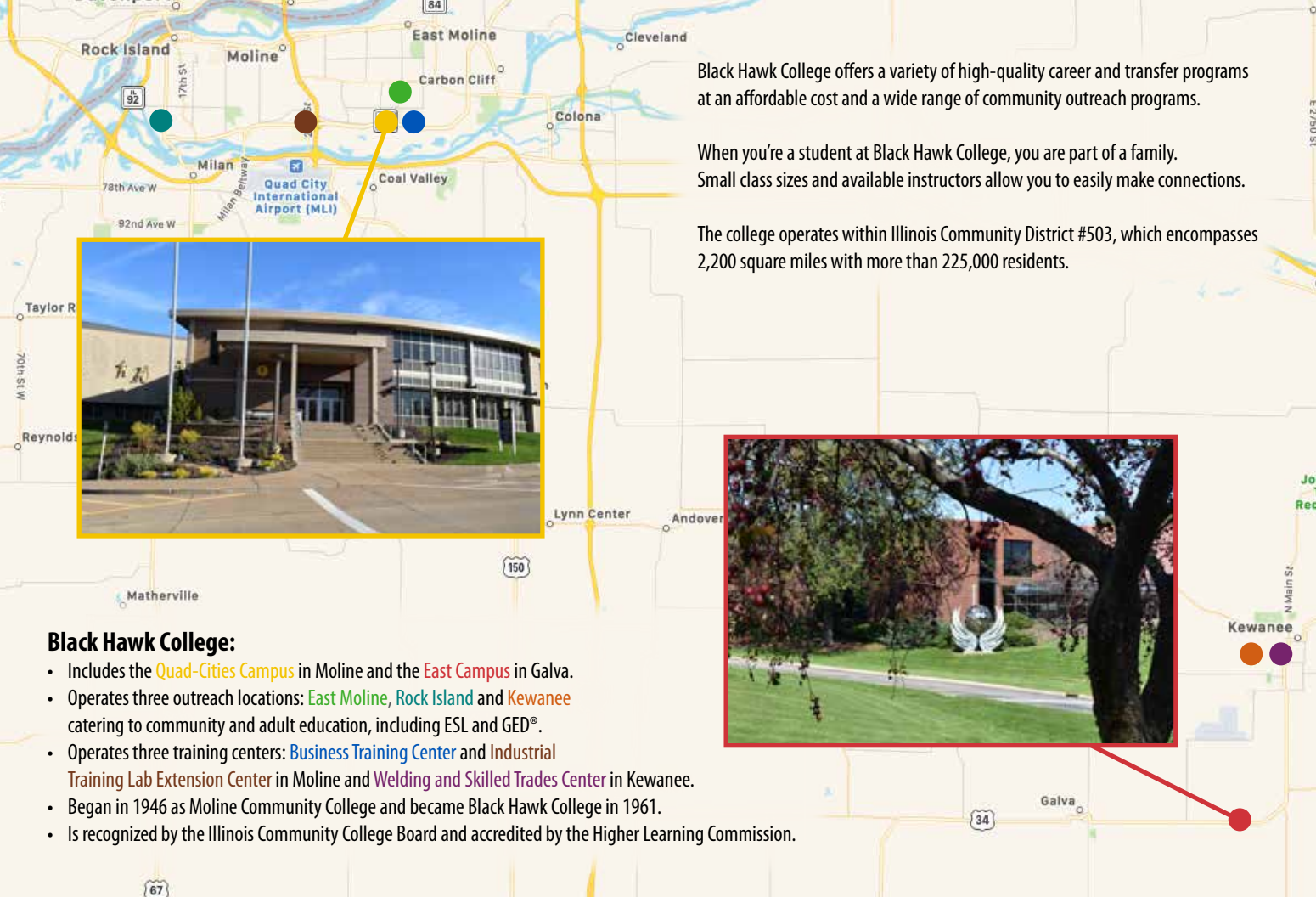

As you wrap up the 60-hour program, you'll be ready to tackle the Illinois Certified Shorthand Reporter (CSR) and the national Registered Professional Reporter (RPR) exams, fully equipped for a successful career in court reporting.



Cybersecurity (AAS)

Embark on a journey into the dynamic realm of cybersecurity, where safeguarding critical data is paramount for businesses, industries and governmental entities.

In our cybersecurity program, you'll blend theoretical knowledge with practical application through immersive learning experiences in both classroom settings and enriching internships.

Our comprehensive curriculum covers a spectrum of fundamental subjects, including computer hardware, networking, operating systems, and programming and scripting courses. You'll also have the opportunity to pursue industry certifications such as CompTIA A+, Network+, Security+ and Cisco CCNA, enhancing your professional credentials.

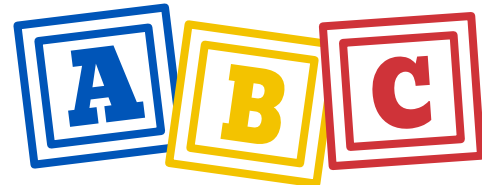

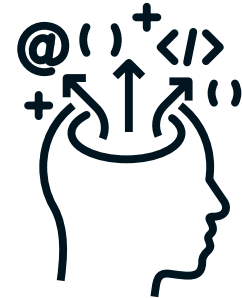

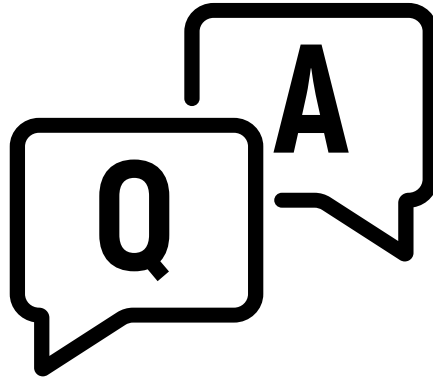

Log in to myBHC student portal to access Hawk's Journey and determine if you need to complete placement testing.

Apply for financial aid by submitting a FAFSA (www.fafsa.gov) and monitoring your myBHC email for updates.

5

Send SAT/ACT scores to Enrollment Services at registrar@bhc.edu or schedule an appointment for placement testing in our testing center.

6

Meet with your assigned advisor to choose classes and register. All new degree-seeking students must meet with an advisor to create a schedule.

Check payment options, due dates and pay online.
